

## **FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

The bell choir played in church yesterday. I love when the bell choir plays because I have always loved the sound of bell choirs, and our bell choir does a great job. Yesterday they played a tune called Lenten Introspection and it really allowed me to find a peace and focus I had been lacking all morning up to that point. So first off, thank you Erika and the bell choir. Because that tune stayed with me, however, I spent the afternoon thinking about the bell choir and the nature of the bell choir – its challenges and strengths. (I did this as I worked in the yard, not just sitting in a chair pondering the meaning of bell choirs.) What I decided was that the bell choir seems an apt illustration for church life. Here is my thinking:

A bell choir takes a group of people, gives them each their own task, their own instrument or set of instruments, their own notes to follow. But then each individual playing their own thing comes together in a whole to make a beautiful piece of music. If any one of those individuals is gone, their absence is greatly felt. The others cannot simply compensate for them. Others cannot play louder. Someone has to pick up their bells and play their part or the whole piece breaks down. It takes everyone working together to make it work. There is no way to compensate for the missing player like there may be in other choirs and bands. That puts a lot of responsibility on the players and they place a lot of trust in each other.

And that, to me, is what the church is like. Everyone has a role to play. Everyone has work to do. Everyone has a task that fits into the bigger picture of God's ministry and mission in the church. And if people cannot play their part for whatever reason, others are there to pick up the mantle and carry on the work. Sometimes we need a break. Sometimes we do not feel strong enough to do the task. Sometimes we need to be cared for and do not have the strength to be the caregiver in that time, so the church takes over and covers for us. I went on sabbatical for three months and many people from this congregation stepped into my place to cover for me. The church did not stop. Ministry did not stop. Worship did not stop. We all have a vital part to play. It may just be one note to ring, but without that note, others don't know when to come in or there is a pause in the piece. What you do in this church is important. You have a role to play. Maybe for now it is just participating in programs, sharing fellowship with one another, or playing the part of the learner. Maybe it feels like just stopping in to visit a homebound member of the church, or bringing a soup to soup supper, or a couple hours of serving food at the Shalom Center, or singing out in church even if you don't know the tune so well, or picking up some trash on the church grounds, or serving on a committee, or whatever. Trust me, if you don't do it someone else has to step up to do it. There are no unimportant tasks. It is all part of

the bigger picture of making this congregation a welcoming, inviting, loving, grace-filled place to do ministry and mission. Each player has a role to play and without you, the final product is very different.

## **JAM MINISTRY EMERGING FROM HIBERNATION**

The winter hiatus is over and March 4 marks the beginning of the new Jam Ministry project, that we will call *Moving Madagascar's Mountain*. I suppose we could shorten that to *3-M*, but that's already been trademarked!

The mountain is Madagascar's need of education and the Christian gospel in the fourth poorest country in the world, where over half of the population of 25 million still practice traditional religions and many of those who claim to be Christians also mix in those practices in their religious activities.

Presbyterian World Mission wants to help their partner, the Reformed Church of Jesus Christ in Madagascar, to improve their church schools and we will be supporting Jan Heckler, an education specialist who will be leaving the US later this year to train principals and teachers in Madagascar.

The Jam Ministry already has \$500 on hand, thanks to the donation of the Chili Supper proceeds and a small but meaningful donation. On March 4 and following Sundays, you will be able to donate to the Jam Ministry and obtain a variety of jams: apple butter, cranberry and cranberry orange, blueberry, strawberry rhubarb, and others. You will also be asked to become more involved in the ministry in a variety of ways. The most obvious – and even urgent – way is to bring back your empty jars (8- and 4- ounce regular mouth – not wide – jars, and the 12-ounce jars used for the grape jelly in the fall) or to donate new ones.


## **PALM SUNDAY BREAKFAST**

## **PARISH NURSE NOTES**

Hopefully, most people have escaped the flu bug that is racing around this year. If you got a flu shot...good for you. The protection from the vaccine is never 100%. There are so many strains of flu virus out there that picking the right ones to vaccinate for becomes a best guess. If you've had the injection and develop the flu anyway, it will most likely be a milder case. There have been a lot of sinus infections, bronchitis, and bad colds around as well. When in doubt, call your doctor's office for advice. All-over joint pain and a high fever are often associated with the "real" flu. If a cough is producing thick yellow sputum, give the doctor a call. In any case, keep fluid intake adequate, rest to give your body time to heal, and please stay home. Don't spread what you have to others, and don't pick up what others may bring to you! And....wash your hands!!
